Who is A.L.O.T.?

A.L.O.T. (Albert's Leaders of Tomorrow, named after Albert Einstein) is a group of teens and adults who work together to prevent and reduce mental health and other health disparities among Black African American and Latino teens throughout the Bronx.



Will I get paid for my participation on this project?

Yes. Teens are paid for meetings attended, extra in-office work hours, and outside assignments completed. A meal is always provided at the weekly A.L.O.T. meeting. Payment amount and details will be discussed at the A.L.O.T. Information Session. There are also additional benefits of working on this project such as job/college references, free events, and learning new skills.

Who participates on this project?

A.L.O.T. is made up of teens who live in the Bronx (ages 14-19), adult members (researchers, program specialists and other specialists who work with teens), and staff.

What is B.Y.A.P.?

B.Y.A.P. is Bronx Youth As Partners in Community-Based Participatory Research. B.Y.A.P. is a collaboration between A.L.O.T. and a Coalition of more than 56 agencies throughout the Bronx and NYC.

When and how often does A.L.O.T. meet?

A.L.O.T. meets every Monday evening from 4:00-6:30PM. A.L.O.T. is a long-term commitment.

Who is sponsoring this project?

B.Y.A.P. & A.L.O.T. are supported through funding from the National Center on Minority Health and Health Disparities (NCMHD).
